LIFE is LIKE a BOX of CHOCOLATES CMC'S FIRST TAVE PATIENT

If life is like a box of chocolates, then saving a life is like a heart shape box of chocolates. That's exactly what Ed Pfannkoch of Manchester brought with him on a recent check-up with his doctors at Catholic Medical Center's Cardiac Center.

"This candy box is almost as big as Dr. Flynn's heart," Ed said with a smile as he posed for a photo with interventional cardiologist, James Flynn. MD, FACC and the Director of the Cardiac Catherization Laboratory and Interventional Cardiology at CMC.

Ed Pfannkoch is something of a celebrity at CMC. He was the first patient to undergo a brand new procedure called Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement or TAVR. It saved Ed's life.

The Manchester man suffers from aortic stenosis, or valve disease, which is the cause of more than 25,000 U.S. deaths every year. Seven percent of people over 65 have the disease. The five year survival rate for untreated symptomatic patients is just 3%. Ed was feeling the effects of the disease every day.

Last December, Ed was the first patient to undergo this procedure at CMC. It was not a difficult decision for him to make. He was not afraid; he was excited.

"I knew we were doing our best to help me make it a bit longer," says the 84-year old Pfannkoch. "Hey, I'm past my expiration date."

The procedure took two hours. Dr. Flynn replaced the faulty aortic valve and put the new valve in place. Ed's vitals immediately grew strong.

"It was the first one," says Dr. Flynn of the procedure. "But it went perfectly."

CMC performs the TAVR in a hybrid operating room, unlike any other hospital in the state. This provides total flexibility to handle any medical challenges

"I couldn't do anything, I would walk down to the end of my driveway, which is steep and long and I had no breath left."

For many years, doctors had few options to help patients like Ed. Those with aortic stenosis are often too sick to handle major surgery. But TAVR is a non-invasive surgical technique that uses advanced technology to offer a new answer. The first commercially approved valve for TAVR surgery in the U.S. became available late 2011.

that arise from a complicated procedure on high-risk patients. Should the need arise to convert to an open-heart surgery, the patient does not need to be moved to another operating room, saving precious minutes if need be.

That was never an issue for Ed.

"We talked the day after surgery and I told him we'd keep him for a few days," recalls Dr. Flynn. "He said, 'I think I can go home today.' He looked really good from the first day."

Ed isn't tackling the driveway yet, but his stamina improves daily. He walks through his house constantly, building strength.

CMC has already performed ten TAVR procedures and more are being scheduled. It is a last resort for many who had no further surgical options just a few months ago.

"It's very exciting," says Dr. Flynn. "It's a major game changer for people who are not surgical candidates."

It cannot help every patient, but Dr. Flynn sees TAVR as the beginning of a medical revolution in valve surgery. "Ten years from now, the entire landscape of these surgeries will be completely different."

The landscape is already different for Ed. The driveway does not look so imposing anymore, and he is proud to be the first TAVR patient at the New England Heart Institute.

"Every one of the medical staff was just amazing," says Ed. "I feel wonderful."



Uncompensated Costs of Government Programs: \$44,943,471

(Includes Medicare/Medicaid shortfall)

Government funding of Medicare and Medicaid does not cover the full cost of providing health care services to residents who qualify for these programs. The shortfall between the costs incurred by Catholic Medical Center for providing these services and government reimbursement totaled more than \$44 million during fiscal year 2013. This sizeable community benefit fills the gap in providing much-needed health care services to children, expectant women, adults with dependent children, people with disabilities, and seniors age 65 and over who qualify for assistance.

Charity Care: \$8,783,845

CMC has a generous charity care policy assisting patients with incomes up to 200% above the federal poverty level by providing free or discounted health services. Charity or uncompensated care is a community benefit that is truly a lifeline for those who qualify for assistance.

Subsidized Health Services: \$16,607,452

In keeping with the mission of the organization, Catholic Medical Center offers a variety of programs that serve those most in need: the poor, the uninsured and underinsured.

The New England Heart Institute is recognized as the regional experts on cardiovascular health and provides multiple outreach services throughout the state. New Outpatient Option for Hernia Patients

Approximately 600,000 hernia repair operations are performed annually in the United States,* often requiring a costly hospital stay. CMC's Surgical Care Group (SCG) is proud to collaborate with Bedford Ambulatory Surgery Center (BASC) in the development of a regional hernia center in Manchester that will offer comprehensive services including outpatient surgery.

The center will provide advanced services for management of complex hernias as well as provide a low cost alternative for patients who qualify for outpatient surgery. The BASC offers site of service care, which can reduce your out-ofpocket costs, as well as the overall cost of health care. Check your individual insurance plan to learn if you can benefit from site of service options. These advanced services will incorporate the latest techniques in complex hernia repair, including open and laparoscopic techniques, mesh repair and component separation. Complex surgery will be performed at CMC while outpatients may have surgery at either BASC or CMC.

For an evaluation, have your primary care physician place a referral, or simply contact the SCG where the patients will be evaluated to determine the most appropriate approach and most appropriate setting for your hernia repair.

The Surgical Care Group's Dr. Robert Catania, Dr. Richard Tomolonis and Dr. Wu are all board certified surgeons who have a combined 30 years of surgical experience in the management of all types of hernias, from outpatient inguinal and umbilical hernias to complex incisional and other difficult hernias. They will assess patients to determine the most appropriate approach for their hernia as well as the most appropriate setting, either at CMC or the BASC. The SCG office is located at 87 McGregor St, Suite 3100 and the phone number is 603.627.1887.

Healing Hand Tools New Rehab Technique Introduced at CMC

Do you have low back pain, tennis elbow, plantar fasciitis, neck pain? A new treatment at CMC's Outpatient Rehab could help.

As a modification to the traditional hands-on therapy used to increase joint movement or relax and stretch tight muscles and ligaments, the Graston Technique® involves the use of hand-held patented stainless steel instruments that are applied to affected areas to help treat and relieve pain.

Originally developed for athletes, this technique is now used in hospital outpatient facilities around the globe and by many professional and college athletic programs as well

as in industry and entertainment, including the New England Patriots, the U.S. Olympic teams, Cirque du Soleil, the Naval Special Warfare Groups and Disney Entertainment.

CMC's Rehabilitation staff recently completed advanced training in the Graston Technique®. "Our physical and occupational therapists use the stainless steel instruments to comb over tissue, which immediately identifies problem areas," shares



Victor Carbone, Manager, CMC's Outpatient Rehabilitation and Bedford Physical Therapy.

The instruments release adhesions and restrictions in the muscle, tendon, ligament or soft tissue to relieve pain, increase circulation and improve motion. "The instrumentassisted soft tissue treatment breaks up damaged tissue and helps it heal," says Victor. "The instruments contour to the body's shape and allow our therapist to focus treatment and control the pressure."

Patients who could benefit from this treatment include post-surgical, muscle and soft tissue sprains and strains, including:

- Ankle pain
- Wrist pain
- Neck pain
- Fibromyalgia
- Tennis elbow
- Back pain
- Golfer's elbow
- Knee pain
- Foot pain
