	Patients on Blood Thinners: YOU MUST check in with your prescribing physician before stopping your medication. If you are currently taking an ASPIRIN daily, do not stop. Below is a list of common blood thinners and when, with physician approval, to discontinue them:  Ticlid (ticlopidine)—stop 10 days prior to procedure  Effient (prasugrel)—stop 7 days prior to procedure  Coumadin (warfarin), Plavix (clopidogrel) or Brilinta—stop 5 days prior  Pradaxa (dabigatron), Eliquis (apixaban) or Xarelto (rivaroxaban)—stop 48 hours prior	You will be fasting prior to your procedure. Have nothing to eat or drink after MIDNIGHT the night before your procedure. If you are taking any medications listed on page 2, start clear liquids at 1:00 PM the day before your procedure. If you have questions regarding which medications you should or should not take the morning of your procedure, please contact the prescribing provider's office. Most medications can be postponed until after your procedure is completed.
