Your Pharmacy Shopping List:

- ☐ 5mg Dulcolax tablets (or generic equivalent called bisacodyl).
- ☐ Two bottles of Miralax (or generic equivalent called polyethylene glycol): One 238g (8.3 oz.) bottle and one 119g (4.1 oz.) bottle.
- ☐ One 64oz and one 32oz Gatorade. Pedialyte or any clear liquid of your choice (Any color EXCEPT for RED. BLUE or PURPLE). Diabetic patients are recommended to purchase a sugar-free version.
- ☐ One bottle Milk of Magnesia (or generic equivalent magnesium hydroxide).

Your Grocery Shopping List:

- ☐ Purchase clear liquid products examples include:
 - sports drinks (not red, blue or purple)
 - apple or white grape juice
 - ginger ale
 - clear broth or bouillon
 - water
 - coffee/tea without milk
 - clear carbonated beverages
 - plain Jell-O (not red, blue or purple and no fruit or toppings)
 - Italian ice

- ☐ Stop taking any iron supplements. ☐ Confirm ride and
- contact phone number to your colonoscopy. You MUST have a ride home from a responsible adult as you will have received sedation for the procedure. (**NO** taxis, Lyft, Uber, etc).
- ☐ Please inform the person providing your ride that the appointment will take approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

- ☐ STOP eating nuts, seeds, corn, beans or any fruit or vegetable with a skin.
- ☐ STOP taking fiber supplements. ☐ Take 2 tbsp. (30cc) of Milk of
 - Magnesia at dinner time.
